

# Saint Spotlight: Mother Teresa

On September 5, we celebrate the feast day of St. Teresa of Calcutta. Mother Teresa, born Agnes Bojaxhiu in the country of Macedonia, was a saint after Mother Mary's own Immaculate Heart. She began her life, a life of love for God, in 1910, and lived until 1997, but as a saint in Heaven, her legacy will never end. Mother Teresa continues to make an impact on countless souls today. The foundress of the Missionaries of Charity, Mother Teresa answered God's call, which she heard while on a train as a young woman. God was calling Mother Teresa to serve Him by serving the poor, and she listened, responding to His call. In everyone she served, Mother Teresa saw the face of Christ. She was met face-to-face with His suffering when she saw people living in extreme poverty, some seriously ill, or close to death, left to care for themselves alone in the streets. An angel in her earthly life, Mother Teresa protected and guided all she met, exemplifying virtues of faith, hope, and love to the women she trained as new Missionaries of Charity, as well as to the poor she directly served. Practicing corporal and spiritual works of mercy, Mother Teresa fed the hungry, prayed for the living and dead, and treated all with dignity, tending to their bodies, minds, hearts, and souls. Everything she did stemmed from her love of Christ, Whom she received in the Eucharist daily. Fed by the life of Christ, Mother Teresa restored life to others by giving hope to people who would otherwise have given up, when so many others had turned a blind eye to them. Deeply humble, Mother Teresa did not take credit for her good works, but gave glory to God, asking Jesus and Mary for their intercession so that she would be a joyful and generous servant each day. "Not all of us can do great things," Mother Teresa said, "but all of us can do small things with great love."
